

Monthly Reflection

Dear Parishioners:

Happy Year of 2025! The holy scriptures from the Book of Numbers 6:22-27 starts off by God telling Moses to tell his brother Aaron how to bless the people of Israel. He says: "May the Lord bless you and keep you! May the Lord let his face shine upon you and look upon you kindly and give you peace" New Year's Day is a time for us to ponder and to ask some questions. It is a time to review the last twelve months as well as take an inventory of our deeds and ask ourselves where are we going at this time in my life? Perhaps this can be a time for new decisions and resolutions. Because it is a new year it is an opportunity to renew our hopes and dreams with regard to personal goals in our life. Most of all we feel that perhaps we still have another chance to do things right. We thank God that we have seen another year to its completion. We made it through 2024, even as we unpack and rewind all the good, bad and ugly of this past year. Estimados Feligreses:

El día de Año Nuevo es un momento para reflexionar y hacer algunas preguntas. Es un momento para revisar los últimos doce meses, así como para hacer un inventario de nuestras acciones y preguntarnos ¿hacia dónde vamos en este momento de mi vida? Quizás este pueda ser un momento para nuevas decisiones y resoluciones. Debido a que es un año nuevo, es una oportunidad para renovar nuestras esperanzas y sueños con respecto a las metas personales en nuestra vida. Reflexión de Corresponsabilidad



Política Sobre Condiciones Climáticas Adversas

An individual may offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit ones soul. A donation of \$10 is requested for each mass intention.

Una persona puede ofrecer una misa por varias razones: por ejemplo, en acción de gracias, por las intenciones de otra persona (como en un cumpleaños) o, como es más común, por el reposo del alma de alguien que ha muerto. No hay que olvidar nunca las infinitas gracias que brotan del Sacrificio de la Misa y que benefician el alma. Pedimos una donación de \$10 para cada intención de misa.

Offering Envelopes

The parish envelope system is an easy and organized way of making your financial contributions to the parish on a regular basis. This system enables us to record the contributions and issue year-end statements for tax purposes. (Such statements can ONLY be issued to those who use the envelopes.) We count on regular use of the envelopes to pay for the upkeep of the church, to help plan for the needs of the parish and to help set realistic goals.

As another option, we suggest our Online Giving program. Online Giving allows participants to donate a recurring contribution that is automatically transferred from your checking or savings account, or even credit card, on a weekly or monthly basis, and you select your own billing date. This Program can be utilized for your Sunday contributions, as well as any Holy Day Collection, and all Special and Diocesan collections. The Online Giving Program is free of charge for parishioners.
